## Senior Spotlight



**Glenda Williams Adamowski** was born to Willie Kelley and Woodrow Wilson Williams on March 6, 1949 in Langdale, Alabama. Her home was in Cusseta, Alabama until 1969, when she moved to Newport News, Va. She went to

Beulah High School from first grade through 12th grade, after which she attended Pelika Vocational Technical School where she received a Business Degree. After making her home in Newport News, she also attended Thomas Nelson Community College and was Certified in Early Childhood Education.

Glenda's fondest childhood memories occurred while living a simple farm life and growing everything her family ate! They raised all kinds of crops...sweet potatoes, watermelon, all kinds of vegetables and fruit. She remembers picking, drying, and selling peanuts, drawing water from a well, and in the early years, there was an outhouse, as well. They lived in a cinderblock house with five rooms and a coal fireplace, which kept them warm by burning wood.

Glenda was the youngest, with three siblings—George, Mack, and Jerry. Jerry is her only living brother today. Her mother, who has also passed, was the rock of the family. She loved them greatly and kept the family close. The family didn't get their first TV until Glenda was ten years old. She loved watching "The Lone

Ranger" with her brothers. She said they worked hard on the farm all week and went to church twice on Sundays and again on Wednesday nights. Her closest friend was Linda Butts from the young age of two until the present time.

Her first job while still in school was in the office of the Texaco Gas Station. After attending vocational school, she worked as a secretary until marrying and moving to Virginia. She married her now deceased husband, Lynn Murphy, in January 1969. They were divorced in 1974. She met her present husband, George Adamowski, in 1975 and they married that same year. They will soon reach their 43rd anniversary this December. They've lived on Cynthia Drive for 41 years now.

Glenda has worked as a secretary, office manager in the office supply store, at Farm Fresh, and for twenty years as a Teacher Assistant with Special Needs Children in the Hampton City Schools. She retired in 2014. They joined Bethany in 1978 after June and Milton VanDeVeer paid them a home visit and have been members here for 40 years. She has served in the Chancel Choir, as Altar Guild member, member of UMW, Missions Committee, and currently is Chairman of our Membership Care Committee. You see her often serving cookies and lemonade after worship services. She also volunteers in the church office and has enjoyed working in the Pumpkin Patch in past years.

Glenda and George have two daughters, Amy Williamson and Kellie Adamowski. They have one very special granddaughter, Amanda, who lives with her parents in Newport News, and

Kellie lives in Smyrna, Georgia. Amanda is a real joy in their life. She is an Honor Roll Student and has been a year-round swimmer for five years. She also enjoys visiting our homebound members and always leaves them with a smile. We appreciate all her effort and dedication here at Bethany.
